EXPRESSIONS FESTIVAL

The Expressions Festival is a two-day celebration coming up in October 2024 at the West Gippsland Arts Centre. This festival will exclusively feature the creative works of young people (aged 12-30), all made in response to our theme: My Happy Place.

Our current plan has the first night of the festival focusing on activating the beautiful foyer spaces in the centre with artworks on the walls, floors, and table displays. These can be explored while listening to the sweet sounds of local musicians, songwriters, and spoken word poets, changing the world with their music and words.

The second night will be a thrilling spectacle inside the theatre, where live performances will take centre stage. Get ready to be captivated by original plays, short films, and dance routines. This night promises to deliver unforgettable performances that will leave you inspired and moved.

Of course, this is just our hope. It will entirely depend on the artists who come forward and what they choose to submit. This is their festival, and we are just here to program their work so it shines the best.

We would love to see the entire community come out to support this work, share messages of encouragement, buy something from a local artisan or from the kiosk, and cheer and clap loudly for the works created.

ARTISTIC THEME

Day One of the festival will be showcasing musicians, poets, writers and visual art displays in and around the centre. Day Two will be showcasing actors, theatre makers and film makers and dancers in the main theatre.

All artists are encouraged to submit work under the theme:

"My Happy Place: Self Expression as a Young Person in 2024."

In a world where self-expression is a form of communication and a tool for connection, this theme invites artists to explore and share their unique interpretations of what it means to find joy, comfort and belonging in their own experiences and identities. "My Happy Place" encourages artists to explore different spaces, both physical and emotional, where they feel most at home and authentic.

Artists of all mediums are invited to submit their work, whether it be visual art, music, performance, literature, or any other form of creative expression. However, each submission must be accompanied by an explanation of how the work reflects the theme. Whether it's through the use of color or shapes, the portrayal of personal experiences, or the exploration of identity, artists are encouraged to express the connection between their work and the theme of "My Happy Place."

Through this festival, we aim to not only showcase the talent and creativity of young artists but also to foster a deeper understanding of the diverse ways in which self-expression can exist in the modern world. Join us as we celebrate the power of art to inspire, and create spaces of joy and belonging for all.

ARTFORM Guidelines

The theme is yours to explore as you will and we encourage you to follow your creativity, wherever it takes you. However, all pieces submitted must abide by our timings or item limits (found on the next page) in addition to the following content warnings:

- Artists can submit in up to four categories in total (E.g. One short film, one photograph, one pottery submission and one original song)
- Coarse language will be permitted in original works but you will be required to write a warning for the audience.
 Information on this will be provided closer toward the festival.
- Nudity, Racism, Homophobia, Transphobia will not be accepted or tolerated under any circumstances. Everyone has a right to feel safe and included at this festival.
- If your submission contains any of the following, you will be required to speak to our Producers before your piece can be performed or displayed.





MUSIC/SONGS/DANCE







POETRY/SPOKEN WORD

- Written pieces have a max length of two (2) A4 pages.
- Spoken word pieces have a max run time of five minutes (5).



VISUAL ART

You can enter

- Up to three small pieces.
- · Up to two medium pieces
- Up to one medium piece and one small piece.
- Up to one large piece.
